

Sept. 15, Sunday – "Tortured for Christ" (77 min)

The Voice of the Martyrs presents "Tortured For Christ" the movie, a true-life cinematic retelling of the testimony of VOM founder Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who kept his faith despite facing 14 years of torture in a communist prison.
